An Exploration of the Perceived Impact and Effectiveness of Taser Use in a South American State: The British Academy (\$6,688)

Proposal Abstract: While Conductive Energy Devices (CEDs, Tasers) have been commonly adopted by many law enforcement agencies across the United States for many years, in some parts of Europe the devices have only very recently begun to be rolled out. As such, an evaluation of the emerging Taser model in Scotland is currently being conducted. Building on this, the proposed qualitative research study will seek to capture the views and perspectives of law enforcement officers and the general public in one southern State County in the United States where Tasers have been used for many years. It will explore the perceived longer-term benefits and risks of Taser deployment and the relationship between their use and the ability of the police to deal with violent situations. The emerging comparative insights will create an additional evidence-base to inform future potential rollout of Tasers on both sides of the Atlantic in the years to come.
